Full-time work and zero-hours work as a pool lifeguard from 2017-2022. I initially worked part-time throughout 2017-20 in order to fund my university studies, but was laid off during the COVID-19 pandemic; eventually returning to the position full-time in March 2022 for similar reasons.

The initial training period qualified me as a first aider, including the use of a defibrillator and dealing with spinal injuries. General responsibilities varied, but my work mostly entailed working on poolside as a lifeguard in half-hour shifts before taking tasks o a taskboard and completing those as the day progressed. These frequently involved work such as general cleaning, interacting with the general public, or anything the Duty Manager required at the time.

Responsibilities would've also included providing first aid in the event of an emergency and helping coordinate what to do with the general public. While nothing serious ever happened on my shifts, constant monthly training kept me prepared and up-to-date on what to do. I gained a lot of experience in basic first aid and better knowledge of dealing with the public as well as general social interaction. I feel it has made me a lot more approachable as a person.
